- 6. How was the pacing?
- 7. Were there points in the story where you found yourself getting bored? Did you ever put the book down voluntarily?
- 8. What was your favorite scene? Why?
- 9. What was your least favorite scene? Why?
- 10. List your three favorite things about the story.
- 11. Would you read the next story, if it were part of a series?

Technical

- 1. Did the POV change? If so, were you able to keep track of who was speaking?
- 2. Were there any timing issues with scene changes, chapter organization, or events?
- 3. Was any information new to you? If so, did the author explain in a way that you enjoyed?
- 4. Did the narrator's voice match the story, time period, etc.?
- 5. Was information repeated unnecessarily?
- 6. How was the language used?
- 7. Is there an appropriate mix of dialogue and narrative?
- 8. Are there any confusing sections that should be made clearer?

Characters

- 1. How unique or original were the characters?
- 2. How did the author do with character descriptions?
- 3. Does each character have realistic motivations, reactions, or desires?
- 4. Does any character act out of character at any point? When and why? Did it make sense?
- 5. Did the characters have depth? Were their skills developed or did things come easily?
- 6. Who was your favorite character? Why?
- 7. Who was your least favorite character? Why?
- 8. Was the protagonist someone you could root for? Were they compelling or sympathetic?
